(a) Incorrect. Islamic views of Mary view her as the most righteous woman who conceived Jesus a virgin without a father; however, while Jesus is thought to be a result of virgin birth, He is not considered divine.

Judaism mostly avoids the debate, though those who argue this issue choose a "young maiden" interpretation rather than "virgin" when the Old Testament prophecy like Isaiah 7:14 is referenced.

- (b) Incorrect. Catholics and Protestants both fully believe that Mary was a virgin when she conceived Jesus in her womb as a result of the Holy Ghost's actions.
- (c) Incorrect. There is always some that try to argue the issue; but, orthodox and traditional belief in this fact and the obvious statement of facts concerning Mary's chastity and pureness in the Word of God prevent serious disagreements from escalating to denial.
- (d) Correct. There are some Jews and a few extremely liberal Protestants that try to make a case for a "young maiden" rather than "virgin" interpretation, but it has had little impact on traditional and orthodox Christian belief.

- (a) Negative. It is not a matter of getting along in Christianity. Rather, it is the upholding of Christ's true natures of Divine and Human that forms a foundation for Christian belief. Both Catholics and Protestants should be on the same page with this belief, not for unity, but for the statement of God's Truth.

- (c) Correct. On one hand, traditional and orthodox doctrines concerning the human and divine natures of Christ define them as indivisible. It is the solid doctrine of Christian belief that identifies the two natures of Christ, but declares them inseparable. Nestorius and others attempt to divide the human and divine natures of Christ, which leads to a denial that Christ is God.

Though Mary is mother to Jesus and giver of the human part of his nature, and is not mother to God, she did contain God within her womb for a while, which is a critical matter of faith. (a) False. While it is true that the basic doctrine has no direct prohibition, it is flawed. The presence of other offspring between Mary and Joseph, as well as the very human nature of Mary, prevent this possibility, and those things can be found in Scripture.

- (a) True Correct. Catholics think that Mary can intercede with her son, and give one who prays to her salvation as a mediator between the sinner and her son.
- (b) False Incorrect. Sadly, it is true that there are many Catholics that believe Mary plays an important part in granting salvation to sinners. Remarkably, even her son had to die as a sacrifice for sinners; yet, according to the false doctrine of bodily assumption, Mary escapes death and yet is thought to have the right of mediation and intercession for the salvation of sinners.

- (a) True Incorrect. The salvation of Jesus Christ is all a sinner needs to obtain forgiveness, salvation, justification, and eternal life. Going through another, even his beloved and blessed Mother, is not necessary to receive the grace of salvation promised by God through the acceptance of His Son's sacrifice upon the cross for sinners. There is no biblical support of this false representation of Mary's power.
- (b) False Correct. There is no biblical support for Mary as an intercessor between man and the Lord Jesus Christ. The sacrifice of Jesus Christ upon the cross for sinners is sufficient to save all that embrace Him as Lord and Savior.

By falsely suggesting that Mary raised to Heaven without death to her physical body once again makes her superior to Christ that was crucified and died, with His shed blood a requirement for the salvation of men. When Mary is falsely attributed with qualities superior to Christ, and given intercessory role in redemption of her Son's blood, she becomes not only a co-god, but a superior one over the Lord Jesus Christ. (b) Correct. This false teaching makes a sinless Mary, able to function as an unblemished lamb for salvation sacrifice, without the need to sacrifice herself for the sins of mankind. (c) Correct. This false teaching actually elevates her above her Son by making her so pure as to suggest that she never succumbs to her human nature while her Son, Jesus Christ, fully embraces both the human and the divine nature that He possessed. While examples of Christ's humanness do not deal with this subject in biblical accounts, there is no evidence that He elevates his human nature above others and changes the very nature that normal mankind exhibits. For perpetual virginity to exist, especially when the Word of God clearly reports Mary's additional children, suggests a supernatural event that just did not occur. (d) Correct. The adoration and veneration of Mary by the Roman Catholic Church brings prayerful attention and worship to her at the expense of the Lord Jesus Christ. This false teaching muddies the role of Christ, and elevates His mother to a place that is not supported by Scripture and refutes the sufficiency of Christ. (e) Correct. Jesus Christ is sufficient and has no need to be persuaded to invoke the right of

forgiveness and judgment of sinners.

- (a) True Correct. While there is some indication that the rich man in hell can communicate with his servant who is in Abraham's bosom, there is no specific reference of the Lord's believers communicating in the same manner. (Luke 16:19-31)
- (b) False False. Many will think about the parable that Jesus speaks in Luke 16:19-31 with the rich man in hell crying out to Lazarus, his servant who abides in Abraham's bosom, shows communication between the dead. In a sense, it does. However, it speaks of those under Abraham's covenant, and not for those resurrected into eternal life through the New Covenant of Jesus Christ. That lack of evidence prevents a certain belief that prayers can be directed to those that have died before us. Regardless, the prayers of devout believers should be directed to their Lord and their God.

- (c) Correct. Protestants make a point of avoiding devotional acts or requests of Mary, because it is thought to be an idolatrous posture and practice often seen in Catholic worship.
- (d) Correct. The revelation of Mary through God's Word magnifies her special nature that pleases God so much, that He chooses her to be the mother of the Son of God. There is no need to make Mary a co-god with the false teachings of perpetual virginity, immaculate conception, bodily assumption, invocation of Mary, adoration and veneration, or tasking her with an intercessory role. God did not choose a goddess to bear the Son of God. He chose a young virgin girl who ponders when facing spiritual things she does not fully understand, and trusts that whether she understands or not, God is good and faithful, and she has nothing to fear; the Son of God comes to redeem her and us from original sin. We should think of her with honor

and blessings for her faithful carrying of our Lord in our womb that brings salvation to sinners and grants them eternal life through belief in the Son of God.
